

Metro to run with greater frequency

Metro Rail trains would be operated with greater frequency on Wednesday for Wednesday's One Day International cricket match at the RGI stadium at Uppal.

This follows a review that Hyderabad Metro Rail Limited (HMRL) managing director N.V.S. Reddy held with L&T Metro Rail Limited MD K.V.B. Reddy.

On Corridor 3 (Blue Line) trains would be operated with five-minute frequency instead of seven minutes from 11 am to 4 pm, and with four-minute frequency from 4 pm to 10 pm. Two trains will be

kept as standby at Nagole. If there is any crowd after 9 pm, additional trains will be operated. In Corridors 1 and 2, normal operations will be maintained. At the stadium

Metro Station, 10 counters will be operated - five on each side, instead of four.

At the NGRI station, five counters will be operated in addition to the normal two counters.

Baggage scanning will be done on both sides with additional security at the Stadium station. Additional security arrangements will also be made at Nagole, Uppal, and NGRI stations.
