2BHKs for homeless poor, orders CM

ASSERTING that no homeless poor should be left on the streets, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Tuesday directed officials to ensure that all eligible are given a 2BHK house or some alternative is made for them.

The CM also directed officials to collect details of the eligible poor living in catchment areas of the Musi and water bodies in Greater Hyderabad.

He also instructed officials to identify all lakes and other water bodies within ORR limits and determine their FTL and buffer zones, gather details of encroachments and prepare a comprehensive report.

The CM chaired a review meeting at his residence with officials on the Musi Riverfront Development Project, expansion of Metro Rail and other issues pertaining to Hyderabad.

He instructed the officials to take responsibility for the conservation of lakes and to strictly monitor lakes and nalas to prevent encroachments.

The CM said that CCTV cameras should be installed at all

water bodies in the city and linked with the Integrated Command and Control Centre. "There is an imperative need to protect water bodies from encroachments keeping in mind the future needs of the citizens and to prevent natural calamities," he said. CONTINUED ON P4

16,000 2BHKs earmarked for Musi riverfront oustees

THE state government has earmarked as many as 16,000 twobedroom (2BHK) houses for the families who stand to be displaced by the Musi Riverfront Development Project. An order allocating 2BHKs to the oustees is expected to be issued soon.

Various government departments that have carried out surveys on the encroachments along the Musi banks and buffer zone have identified around 10.200 encroachments.

The collectors of Hyderabad, Rangareddy and Medchal-Malkajgiri districts will deploy teams from Wednesday which will visit each of the identified structures and counsel the occupants on the project and the need for them to move.

People owning lands in the buffer zone of the river will be compensated as per the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (RFCTLARR) Act. Accordingly, they would be offered structural compensation as per RFCTLARR Act, which includes structural value, cost of land if they hold pattas and a 2BHK house. People who have encroached the riverbed and built houses on it will only get a 2BHK house as they are not entitled for compensation.

It may be recalled that Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy had categorically stated that all those affected by the project would be rehabilitated as per law and no injustice will be done to them.

Recently, in-charge minister for Hyderabad Ponnam Prabhakar inspected 2BHK colonies at Chanchalguda and Vanasthalipuram and said that the government will ensure justice for the families of those affected by the project. He too stated that those displaced by the project would be provided with 2BHK houses.

The chief minister directed the officials to prepare a comprehensive report regarding the construction of the Metro Rail line from the Airport to the proposed Future City. He also instructed them to expedite work on the expansion of the Metro Rail to the Old City. "Maintain special focus on resolving problems related to land acquisition for the project," the chief minister said.

He directed officials to get ready a detailed project report (DPR) for constructing the Metro lines from LB Nagar to Hayathnagar

and MGBS to Chandrayanagutta before Dasara.

The chief minister also directed the officials to gather details of the eligible poor living in the Musi catchment areas and other water bodies in Hyderabad. He suggested to the officials to support the deserving poor.

"Those genuinely deserving of help should not be left on the streets, they should be allotted 2BHK houses or shown some other

alternative," Revanth said.

Municipal Administration department principal secretary dana Kishore, Metro Rail MD NVS Reddy, adviser to government (projects) KS Srinivasa Raju, Ajith Reddy, the special secretary to the chief minister, GHMC commissioner Amrapali Kata, HMDA commissioner Sarfaraz Ahmed and collectors of Rangareddy and Hyderabad districts and other officials were present.
