metro rail construction.

Addressing his staff after unfurling the national flag on the occasion of the 76th Republic Day celebrations

at the Hyderabad Metro Rail Bhavan on Sunday, he said that detailed project reports (DPRs) for the five metro phase-II corridors, including airport connectivity from various parts of the city, have been sent to the Centre. DPRs are also being prepared for Medchal and Shamirpet corridors. He pointed out that the CM has also requested the Centre to expedite approval of the DPRs and pave the way for the construction of the metro extension lines.
