Demolitions for Old City Metro pick up

Officials have begun demolition of properties MGBS between Chandrayangutta for the Old City Metro Rail project. The demolitions will be paused during the month of Ramzan to avoid discomfort to the people.

A total of 1,100 properties will be affected by the 7.5-km Metro Rail between MGBS and Chandrayangutta. The demolition acquired properties will be completed in a few months.

According to the officials, around 50 out of 200 properties, for which
