## Nampally station to get direct link to Metro rail

## Redevelopment works will be completed in 2027

The 'Hyderabad Deccan' railway station, also known as Nampally railway station, which is undergoing a ₹327-crore redevelopment, will be directly connected to the Nampally Metro Station, officials said on Friday.

The work, which commenced in September last, will be completed in around 28 months or January 2027.

A senior official from SCR said that the main focus areas of the redevelopment are segregation of arrival and departure passengers and superior road connectivity and adequate parking space, including basement parking.

"There will also be provision of flexibility for integration of facilities with future transport
