

HMRL MD inspects Future City Metro Corridor

Managing Director of Hyderabad Metro Rail Limited (HMRL) NVS Reddy conducted a field inspection of the Future City Metro Corridor on Sunday. He stated that the project aligns with Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's vision to develop the Future City as the fourth major city after Hyderabad, Secunderabad, and Cyberabad. The goal is to make it a pollution-free, green city of global standards. Hyderabad Airport Metro Ltd (HAML) is preparing a Detailed Project Report (DPR) for this Metro Corridor.

NVS Reddy inspected the DPR survey from the airport to Skill University at Meerkhanpet. Due to the lack of roads beyond Kongara Kalan, the team trekked



through rough terrain for the inspection. The Metro route, approximately 40 km long, will begin at Shamshabad Airport, follow the airport boundary for 5 km along Mansanpally Road and reach Pedda Golconda ORR Exit. Two Metro stations are

planned at Bahadurguda and Pedda Golconda to develop 1,500 acres of government land into a world-class hub.

From Pedda Golconda, the elevated Metro will extend 14 km along the ORR to Raviryala Exit. From there to

Skill University, it will run at road level along the 100-meter-wide Green Field Road.

NVS Reddy recalled his past proposal to reserve space for the Metro along the ORR during Dr YSR's tenure. Critics doubted it, but both ORR and Metro became reality, boosting Hyderabad's global appeal. He emphasised that the current government's infrastructure projects will further enhance Hyderabad's future. HAML will collaborate with HMDA, TSIIC, and other agencies to implement CM Revanth Reddy's vision.

He noted that the DPR for Future City, along with the North City Medchal and Shamirpet Corridors, will be completed by March and submitted for approval. Engineers and officials participated in the inspection.
