

Rs. 19,579 cr sanctioned for Hyd Metro Phase-II(B)

The Telangana government has accorded administrative sanction for Hyderabad Metro Rail Phase-II (B), comprising three new corridors over a total length of 86.1 km at an estimated cost of Rs. 19,579 crore.

This major expansion will be executed as a 50:50 Joint Venture (JV) between the Government of Telangana and the Government of India through Hyderabad Airport Metro Limited.

According to the order issued through G.O. Ms. No. 113 dated June 16, 2025, the three proposed corridors include: Corridor IX: RGIA to Future City (Skills University) – 39.6 km, Corridor X: JBS to Medchal – 24.5 km and Corridor XI: JBS to Shamirpet – 22.0 km

The combined Phase-II(B) corridors will significantly enhance connectivity to Hyderabad's emerging institutional, industrial, and educational zones, especially in the northern and southern parts of the city.

This development follows the earlier approval of Phase-II (A) comprising five corridors totalling 76.4 km.

While Phase-I (69 km) was implemented under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model, Phase-II (B) takes the JV route with structured financial planning.
